The wedding ring is a symbol of the unbroken circle of love with no beginning and no end. May these rings always remind you of the vows you have taken and the love that is between you and surrounds you today.

May we have the rings?

Groom, please place the ring on Bride's finger and say these words:

With this ring, I take you as my wife.

Bride, please place the ring on Groom's finger and say these words:

With this ring, I take you as my husband.

Let us pray:

Gracious Lord our hearts are filled with great happiness as Groom and Bride have shared their marriage vows and today and affirm their faith and love for one another. May they ever be true and loving. Temper their hearts with kindness and understanding, rid them of all pretense or jealousy. And with the passage of time, may they always find great contentment in the rich joy of each other's companionship.
